For elementary students, learning math facts is important to success in math. Students are expected to master their facts before starting 4<sup>th</sup> grade. Below are the expectations for what students should master for each grade level, Kindergarten – 5<sup>th</sup> grade.

**Kindergarten** Addition and subtraction facts to 5

**1<sup>st</sup> Grade** Addition and subtraction facts to 10

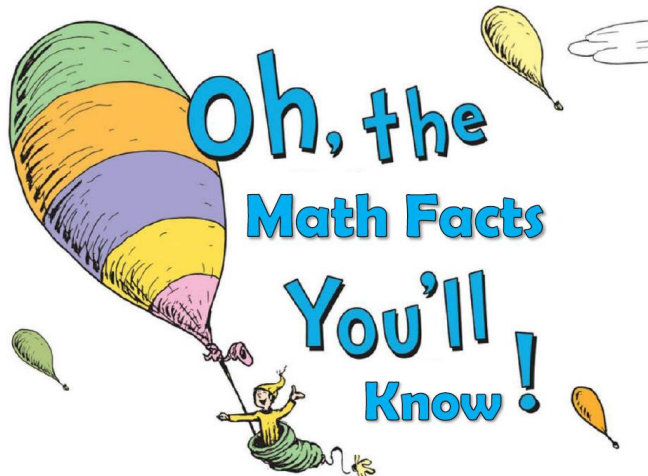
**2<sup>nd</sup> Grade** Addition and subtraction fact to 20  
Addition and subtraction within 100  
(paper/pencil)

**3<sup>rd</sup> Grade** Multiplication and division facts to 100  
Addition and subtraction within 1000  
(paper/pencil)

**4<sup>th</sup> Grade** Facts Mastered  
Addition and subtraction within 1,000,000  
(paper/pencil)

**5<sup>th</sup> Grade** Facts Mastered  
Multi-digit multiplication

Our district has a math fact plan in place to help students achieve these expectations. The plan includes support for students who do not master their math facts by the end of 3<sup>rd</sup> grade.
